A remarkable pictorial history documenting the Sikh prowess in war with early prints and paintings dating back to the 1700s, and photographs from the 1850s to the present day.

The book traces the spiritual and ethical origins of the Sikh call-to-arms, the martyrdoms and conflict of the Mughal period, the founding of the Khalsa by

Guru Gobind Singh, the Afghan and Persian invasions, the rise of the Sikh kingdoms, the Anglo-Sikh wars and the contribution of Sikhs in both World Wars and more recent international conflicts. The commentary is accompanied by quotes from allies and foes of Sikhs soldiers through the ages and from the Sikh Gurus. Detailed picture captions add military substance and tell human stories.
